

For nearly a week, large quantities of sand from the Sahara have been brought to the skies above Europe by air currents from the South. It's a pretty normal phenomenon but, this time, the sand has been a killjoy for flying as well. Even if at the beginning of the week, the weather forecasters promised thermals for many regions, the sand in the atmosphere greatly reduced the amount of sunshine.

In fact, the models used for weather forecasting don't take into account this type of pollution which, all the same, can darken the sky significantly and limit the thermals, spoiling a day which looked promising for the first big XCs... Dust or no dust, today is toast in France as a big front is sweeping across the country.
